

2018 Senior 4 Ball Championship Twin Oaks Country Club- May 22-23 NOTICE TO PLAYERS

(This Notice to Players supplements and modifies any Championship information on the Missouri Golf Association's website and the Missouri Golf Association Local Rules and Conditions of Competition as set forth on the back of the Official Score Card and on the Missouri Golf Association's website.)

Conditions

<u>Teeing Ground:</u> Play will be from the following Teeing Grounds: Players in the Championship Flight will play the **Blue Tee markers**

Players in the Super Senior Championship Flight (65 and over) will play from the White Tee markers

Players in the Net Flight 50-59 will play from the White Tee markers

Players in the Net Flight 60-69 will play from the White Tee markers

Players in the 70 and over Net Flight will play from the Green Tee markers

<u>Scoring</u>: The marker is required to record for each hole only the <u>gross score</u> of whichever partners score is to count. The gross score to count must be individually identifiable: otherwise the side is disqualified

Practice on or Near Hole Last Played Prohibited: See Rule 7-2 Note 2 and Appendix 1 Part B5b

Suspension Of Play Due To A Dangerous Situation (Note To Rule 6-8b): Note under Rule 6-8b and the Optional Condition set forth in Appendix 1 of the USGA Rules of Golf shall be in effect. All practice areas shall be closed during suspension for a dangerous situation until the Committee has declared them open. When play is suspended by the Committee for a dangerous situation, if players are between the play of two holes, they must not resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they are in the process of playing a hole, they must discontinue play immediately and not resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If a Player fails to discontinue play immediately, he is disqualified, unless circumstances warrant waiving the penalty as provided in Rule 33-7. Appendix 1 Part B4.

<u>Note:</u> A suspension for a dangerous situation shall be signaled by one (1) prolonged siren or airhorn note. All other types of suspension shall be signaled by three (3) consecutive siren or airhorn notes. Resumption of play shall be signaled by two (2) short siren or airhorn notes, repeated.

<u>Ties:</u> Champions will be determined by a hole-by-hole play-off immediately following the final Round. In the Championship Flight and Super Senior Championship Flights Only. All announcements will be made at the scoreboard located inside the clubhouse by the scorer's table immediately following the conclusion of the final Round.

<u>Pace of Play:</u> See MGA Pace of Play Policy. For this tournament groups will be expected to play as follows: (4 hours and 45 minutes.

Local Rules

Teeing Area Defined: For the purpose of applying Rule 6-3a (including the penalty statement and exception) and Rule 4-4, the teeing area includes the teeing ground and surrounding area.

Score Cards and Scoring Area (For the purpose of applying Rules 6-6b and 6-6c):

Players should return their score cards, as soon as possible, to the scorer's table located inside the clubhouse room on the lower level facing the golf course to the side of the bar area defined by the scoring table and ropes.

NOTE: Any unresolved Rule issues or Rule questions should be resolved among the players and the Official in Charge before returning the score card. Additionally, a Committee notification required of the player for playing a second ball pursuant to Rule 3-3 or Rule 20-7c "Playing a second ball" must be made before the score card is returned. The penalty for not reporting to the Committee is **Disqualification**.

Doubt as to Procedure (See Rule 3-3a): If a competitor is doubtful of his rights or the correct procedure during the play of a hole, he may, without penalty, complete the hole with two balls. To proceed under this Rule, he must decide to play two balls after the doubtful situation has arisen and before taking further action (e.g., making a stroke at the original ball). The competitor should announce to his marker or a fellow-competitor:

- that he intends to play two balls; and
- which ball he wishes to count if the Rules permit the procedure used for that ball.

Before returning his card, the competitor must report the facts of the situation to the Committee. If he fails to do so, he is **Disqualified.**

<u>Out of Bounds:</u> Defined by inside points, at ground level, of white stakes and/or fence posts defining the perimeter of the Club property. If the stake or post is set in a concrete base and the concrete is above ground level, ground level is where the post meets the concrete. The concrete base which is above ground and in bounds is NOT an Obstruction. Rule 27-1 and Definition of Obstruction. Maintenance Shed left of 6 fairway is out of bounds.

<u>Obstructions:</u> Include landscaped garden areas completely encircled by an obstruction and worn areas adjacent to approaches and exits from cart paths. Rule 24.

Dropping Zone for Water Hazard on Hole #15: If a ball last crosses the water hazard (marked yellow) and lies in or touches the water hazard situated on the 4th Hole, the Competitor **MAY**, proceed under Rule 26-1; or under the penalty of one (1) stroke, drop a ball in the Dropping Zone (DZ) (forward Teeing Ground).

<u>Distance Measuring Device(s):</u> For this Competition, the Committee has adopted the Local Rule allowing Distance Measuring Devices that measure **Distance Only** pursuant to the Note under Rule 14-3. Appendix 1 Part B9. **Penalty for breach of the Condition: Disqualification.**

<u>Electronic Devices:</u> The use of an Electronic Device(s) during the Qualifying Round, while not prohibited, **May lead to Disqualification.** Decisions 14-3/16 through 14-3/18.

<u>Discontinuance of Play:</u> Note under Rule 6-8b and the Optional Condition set forth in Appendix 1 of the USGA Rules of Golf shall be in effect. All practice areas shall be closed during suspension for a dangerous situation until the Committee has declared them open. When play is suspended by the Committee for a dangerous situation, if players are between the play of two holes, they must not resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they are in the process of playing a hole, they must discontinue play immediately and not resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If a Player fails to discontinue play immediately, he is disqualified, unless circumstances warrant waiving the penalty as provided in Rule 33-7. Appendix 1 Part C4.

<u>Note:</u> A suspension for a dangerous situation shall be signaled by one (1) prolonged siren or airhorn note. All other types of suspension shall be signaled by three (3) consecutive siren or airhorn notes. Resumption of play shall be signaled by two (2) short siren or airhorn notes, repeated.
