The teams will play a Solheim Cup format starting on Wednesday, July 1st with foursomes in the morning and four-ball in the afternoon. On Thursday, July 2nd they will play singles matches. Each player will receive one point for each match won, ½ point for a tie. The team with the highest total points will be the Four State Champion of 2020.

Coming fresh off a final round duel at the 2020 Junior Match Play Championship in Bolivar, sisters Taryn and Ella Overstreet will be joining the team and helping in a large way. Taryn came out on top at the 2020 Junior Match Play championship and has many more achievements under her belt. Being a state qualifier for three years, she has proven to be a great asset for the Missouri Four State team. Taryn will be taking her golf talents to Drury University in the Fall.

Ella will be a junior at Jackson High School next year and has proven to be a great golfer at a young age. She has been to state twice and took her team to a third-place finish as a sophomore.

The next player on the team, from Kansas City, MO, is Abby Howard. As team captain of the Liberty High School golf team, Abby led her team to conference and district championships. Abby will be heading to Drury in the Fall alongside Taryn. Greta Hinds, from Jefferson City, will be the 4th player of the team. Playing at a varsity level since freshman year as well as being the 2019 Missouri Golf Association Junior Tour points leader, she has some serous golf experience under her belt that will shine throughout the tournament. The 5th and youngest player on the Missouri team is Audrey Rischer. Audrey is from Columbia and has proven to be a very talented golfer.
